In the rapidly evolving landscape of digital assets, including cryptocurrencies, NFTs, and stablecoins, users face complex challenges in understanding and fulfilling their tax obligations. The IRS Digital Asset Initiative working group recognizes the need to improve taxpayer compliance through enhanced user experiences in digital asset reporting. The Office of Online Services (OLS) aims to bridge the gap between the technical complexities of digital asset transactions and the IRS's mission to provide taxpayers with clear, accessible guidance and reporting mechanisms. OLS's User Experience Services (UES) team will conduct multi-phased research to understand the task flow and challenges taxpayers face when reporting digital assets and assess the effectiveness and clarity of guidance provided on the IRS.gov Digital Asset page. Research will include comprehensive user interviews, surveys, and user testing to gather qualitative and quantitative data on taxpayers' experiences, pain points, and preferences related to digital asset reporting. The first phase of research will include user interviews with 20 new and experienced digital asset investors. Users will answer questions about their

general experience with digital assets and their understanding of taxable events. Users will then be asked to review the Digital Asset page on IRS.gov and answer questions about whether they believe they have experienced taxable events based on the information provided on the page. A third-party vendor will recruit participants for this study using their internal database of volunteer participants. This project will better enable the IRS to achieve its mission by providing a set of targeted recommendations for the IRS to improve its digital interfaces, instructional content, and overall user experience - paving the way for increased digital asset reporting compliance.
