What you need to do immediately

If you made a payment that's not reflected in the amount above

- If you already paid the full amount due in the past 4 weeks, you don't need to do anything.
- If you mailed your payment more than 4 weeks ago, please send us proof of payment, such as a copy of the money order, cashier's receipt, or check (front and back). Mail the payment copy, along with a copy of the first page of this notice, to the address at the top of the notice.
- In addition, if your previous payment was for an amount less than \$1,500.00, please pay the remaining balance using one of the payment options in this notice or mail your payment with the payment stub on this notice.
- If we notified you that we suspended enforced collection on your
 account because it would create a financial hardship (meaning you
 would be unable to pay basic reasonable living expenses if we levied)
 and your financial situation has not changed, you don't need to do
 anything.

An offer in compromise allows you to settle your tax debt for less than the full amount you owe. If you don't pay the amount due or call to make payment arrangements, we will continue to send you annual reminder notices of your balance due until the statute of limitations for collection expires.
